# **Erasmus+ Student Study Mobility Application Announcement**

Students will be sent abroad within the scope of Erasmus+ Student Study Mobility.

Within the scope of Erasmus + Student Study Mobility, students who meet the following application requirements who want to study in European institutions that we have contracted for the 2025-2026 Fall Semester will be sent abroad.

• 2024 Study Mobility Quotas for the Grant Agreement: 8 *(It is an estimated number; the results may vary when announced)* 

### **Application Requirements:**

- 1. The student must be a full-time student enrolled in a higher education program at any of the formal education levels (associate and undergraduate) within the higher education institution,
- 2. Be at least a second year student when going abroad,
- 3. Have an academic GPA of at least 2.20/4.00,
- 4. Sufficient number of ECTS credits if they will apply for study mobility,
- 5. If he/she has benefited from Erasmus+ mobility within his/her current education level, the total duration together with the new activity should not exceed 12 months.

#### Information:

- Applications will be made between <u>28.03.2025- 23.04.2025</u>
- Applications will be made online through TURNAPortal (https://turnaportal.ua.gov.tr/giris), the system of the Turkish National Agency.
- Students must fill in their information completely until 12:00 on April 23 at the latest.
- If available, they should upload their TOEFL, PTE or equivalent exam result document and transcripts showing their foreign language proficiency level and their transcripts to the online application form.
- Applications submitted after the application deadlines will not be evaluated.
- Late/early applications with missing documents will not be accepted.
- Double major students can only apply for mobility in one major in the same application period.
- Among the students whose applications are evaluated and accepted, those who do not have any foreign language proficiency certificate must take the Erasmus Foreign Language Proficiency Exam on April 28, which will be prepared by the School of Foreign Languages. Details about the exam will be announced on April 25.



# Evaluation criteria and weighted scores to be used in evaluating applications:

Academic Success Level	50% (out of 100 points)
Language Level	50% (out of 100 points)
Children of Martyrs and Veterans	+15 Points
Students with Disabilities (provided that the disability is documented)	+10 Points
Within the scope of Social Services Law No. 2828 and Child Protection Law No. 5395, protection, care or accommodation decision has been taken.	+10 Points
Submitting an internship acceptance letter at the time of application	+10 Points
Those who receive aid from AFAD for themselves or their first degree relatives	+10 Points
Internships for digital experiences (DOTs) are directed.	+5 Points
Previous use (with or without grant)	-10 Points
Participating in mobility in places of citizenship	-10 Points
Failure to participate in the mobility without giving a timely waiver notice despite being selected for the mobility	-10 Points
Multiple simultaneous use of two mobility types (changing the student's preferred mobility types applies)	-10 Points
For mobile selected students: Not participating in meetings/trainings organized by the higher education institution with a mobile interest (applicable if the student applies for Erasmus again)	-5 Points
Not taking the language exam without an excuse (applicable if the student re-applies to Erasmus)	-5 Points
